It has been fantastic to have all the children returning to school and teachers are currently working hard to establish where every child is with their learning. To ensure that no one is left behind and any knowledge gaps are filled we are assessing every child in Maths and English prior to the Easter break, and subsequently adapting the learning moving forward as necessary. We have been working closely with the Local Authority and other partnership schools to

establish the essential knowledge and skills children require in preparation for their next academic year. We recognise that transition this year will be even more important.

We do not underestimate the huge strain this year has had on families and we continue to focus on mental health and wellbeing in lessons, utilising our excellent pastoral team of learning mentors and teaching assistants to provide any additional individualised support where required.

We continue to take big strides forward with our school improvement plan and I am immensely proud of the resilience and dedication staff have shown throughout the ever-changing education landscape.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What is Pupil Premium?

We are often asked what Pupil Premium is and how we use our funding to help specific children.

Pupil Premium is extra money we get from the Government to support specific children:

- currently in receipt of means-tested Free School Meals
- previously on means-tested Free School Meals but no longer eligible
- adopted or currently in care
- parents in the military

### What support do we provide these children?



It depends on each child's needs! Sometimes it's money for extra-curricular activities or school uniform. We also support children with a range of interventions, counselling, and check-ins with our Learning Mentors. You can see how our funding is spent by reading our <u>Pupil</u> <u>Premium Strategy on our website</u>.

If a family is in need, they can contact me to ask for funding/support.

### Anything else?

YES! For children currently in receipt of Pupil Premium Free School Meals, they also get **£30** to use for trips, activities, etc. <u>each term.</u>


