# NOTES FROM THE HEADTEACHER

## **Poetry at Balfour**

'Poetry is thoughts that breathe and words that burn.' -Thomas Grav

At Balfour we recognise the value and importance of teaching poetry. We ensure that the poems which we teach through our writing lessons are excellent examples of poetic form, aimed to inspire our children to engage with poetry independently.

For most children, poetry isn't their first choice of independent reading material. However, it is something which many children love to explore and enjoy learning about and is also linked to key opportunities for speaking and listening skill development.

We aim for our teachers to be excellent role models with all aspects of reading and writing. There is a school expectation that teachers hold time to share, discuss and explore a variety of poetic forms outside of writing lessons. We believe in the value of this time within the school day and try to interweave poems into other school experiences such as assemblies.

## Why are poems important?

From a very early age, children engage in nursery rhymes and rhyming narrative texts. They begin to discover that how texts are structured, and the vocabulary included has been done so for impact and purpose. This knowledge of writing and poetry grows as children are given opportunities to look at poems of different forms. They explore unknown words and phrases, syllables and key writing skills such as similes and onomatopoeias.

There are so many different poetic forms. Children love to explore them all and really enjoy the challenge of preparing a different form of writing that often isn't full, complete, punctuated sentences. For example, Haikus! Children love to learn about the art and style of trying to write to match a



particular poetic style. In doing so, they are unravelling many aspects of the English language and structure. In addition to this, it provides children with another form of writing to express themselves. When writing a poem, they often have to make links on a topic/theme and build upon these with their own experiences and those which they may have read about.

Poetry provides an excellent opportunity to develop key speaking and listening skills. By performing poetry or simply reciting a poem children are given opportunities to speak audibly and fluently, participate in performances and develop their spoken intonation. The opportunities to perform poems often help to bring them alive and support children in hearing patterns and language choices made by a poet.

## **Our core poetry at Balfour Primary**

At Balfour we have identified core taught poetry for each year group. This is to ensure that we have coverage of the range of poetic forms and can therefore teach poetic devices alongside them. In addition to this, we have ensured that the poems chosen by each year group are high quality examples of poetry and aim to inspire our children.



Calling all budding writers and poets!

As part of our pledge at Balfour to be at the forefront of acting against climate change, it would be fantastic if you could encourage your child to write a poem to highlight the climate crisis and raise awareness. Poems will be celebrated across the school and displayed for all to read. There will be a winner's prize from each year group! Please hand or send in entries to me before the Christmas holidays.

# **EQUALITY, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION**

What have we been up to in school this month to diversify and decolonise our curriculum?





**Reception** - Reception are learning about Diwali this week! We have been reading 'The Best Diwali Ever', discussing how Diwali can be celebrated and looking at wonderful photos and presentations kindly provided by our amazing families.

**Year 1** - In Autumn term two our English focus is on poetry. We will be including poems from the collection Tiger Tiger Burning Bright, which is an anthology of poems from around the world about different animals.

**Year 2** - We have focused on sharing a variety of diversity texts in assembly for Diversity week and Black History Month.



Year 3 - In Year Three, we will be studying the history of Brighton and how it developed into a seaside town. During the sessions, we will look at Sake Dean Mahamed who was known as the "Shampoo Surgeon" of Brighton. He played in a key part in the development of Brighton as a health resort after Richard Russell had advertised the seawater cures. He is well known as a famous non- European immigrant into the United Kingdom during the 1700s.





Year 4 - This term we will be reading 'Fierce, Fearless and Free' by Lari Don which is a book that contains a selection of myths and legends from around the world with female lead characters from a diverse range of backgrounds. We will be discussing stereotypes, making links and comparing the stories that we read. In RE we are discussing secondary sources of information and how images are presented to an audience. We are using this to challenge stereotypes and discuss how people of different faiths are represented.

**Year 5** - We have poetry week in Year 5, where amongst others, we are looking at the poetry of Valerie Bloom, a Jamaican poet. We will enjoy watching her perform poems such as, 'Sandwich' and 'When Granny'. The children will use her inspiring (and funny) poetry to explore the ABCB rhyming pattern before writing and performing poems of their own.

**Year 6** – During this month, Year 6 has been learning about famous Christians in RE. We have been looking at Harriet Tubman and took part in a Now Press Play experience to discover more about her life. For Black history month the children having been looking at poetry associated with The Windrush. They also performed a poem called the British by Benjamin Zephaniah. In geography, the children having been learning about Fairtrade. They have understood its importance and the impact it has around the world.
