The IQM team helps schools evaluate and measure how they are performing; empowering them to improve and grow. And when they're successful, we recognise their achievement through a system of highly valued awards that provide external validation of their inclusive status.

Inclusion promotes equal opportunities for all pupils, whatever their age, gender, ethnicity, attainment and background. It pays particular attention to the provision made for, and the achievement of, different groups of pupils within a school and any pupils who are at risk of disaffection.

EQUALITY



What have we been up to in school this month to diversify our curriculum?

Reception – This term, Reception have been learning about Around the World. Each week, we have been learning about a country from each of the continents. We have been learning about what food might be eaten, what traditional and modern clothing might be worn and what homes



could look like. We have been discussing similarities and differences between the UK and other countries which we have learned about.

Year 2 - As part of our topic 'Nurturing Nurses' on the history of nursing, Year 2 have been learning about Mary Seacole, a contemporary of Florence Nightingale. We've also been writing biographies of her in our English lessons. As a British Jamaican, Mary Seacole faced many obstacles when she volunteered to help the war effort in the Crimea. We've been inspired to learn how she overcame these challenges with dogged determination and persistence. Although she was forgotten for many years, her story is now recognised as an important part of the history of nursing in the UK.



Year 3 – In Year 3 this term, the children have been reading a wide range of



biographies during their whole class guided reading sessions. The children have spent lots of time reading and learning about Katherine Johnson who was a famous black mathematician who was critical in the success of the first manned NASA space flights in the early 1950s. The children were shocked by how hard she had to work to ensure she was listened to by the leaders of NASA at the time.


in review

Year 4 - We have continued to read 'Secrets of the Sun King' which challenges racial stereotypes and explores the actions we can take to challenge racist behaviour. We have also explored gender roles in Ancient Egypt, with a focus on Cleopatra and her status with Egyptian society. In RE, we've also learnt about religious art and how Christian stories are represented in different ways around the world.



Year 5 – In year 5 we have been discussing fast fashion in our Global

Citizenship lessons where we considered the human costs around the world associated with clothing production. We looked at the motivation for various roles within different international brands in employing people with low pay and dangerous working conditions. We listened to One Plastic Bag: Isatou Ceesay and the recycling women of the Gambia. This is an inspiring true story of



how one African woman began a movement to recycle the plastic bags that were polluting her community. Linking with our topic, we went on to discuss the part we can all play in creating a more sustainable future for everyone.

Year 6 - This half term, Year 6 have been learning about the natural and



physical features of North America. We have been using the text "The Explorer" in English to support our learning of the Americas. In this, a group of children from England and South America end up trying to survive in the Amazon Rainforest following a plane crash. We have used this text as inspiration for the children to research famous explorers in history in order to write a biography. The children have selected explorers from all over the world (Sacagawea, Zheng He, Amelia Earhart, Neil Armstrong etc.) and have been

using the netbooks to make notes about their lives as an explorer.

PUPIL PREMIUM UPDATE

It is hard to believe we are coming to the end of another academic year and it has been so great to complete a full academic year for the first time since 2019.



As part of my Pupil Premium Lead role, I work with Natasha Paling, an EYFS teacher (I'm sure most of you know her!) I am so incredibly grateful for her support and hardworking approach to providing the support needed to our most vulnerable families. She is an amazing teacher and fully dedicated to both her teaching responsibilities and DPP role. I nominated her for a teacher award and unsurprisingly, she WON! So Natasha Paling is officially Outstanding New Teacher of the Year 2022. We are so lucky to have her!

In other news, we have been looking into the criteria for claiming Free School Meals. Currently, you are unable to claim Universal Credit if your household income is more than £7400 per year. In the current times, this is a very small income to survive on. We have started a petition to change this so we will be sending out the details of this in the new academic year - watch this space!

Due to the ever-increasing food prices, we would like to support our families by setting up a food bank on site. We will also send out more information about this in the new academic year.

We hope you have a wonderful summer and we look forward to seeing all of the children upon their return to their new classes.
