

School Streets support the safe movement of children and families travelling to and from school by restricting motor vehicle access on roads with a school gate during school drop off and pick up times, one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon.

This helps to create an environment that enables and encourages more walking, wheeling, cycling and scooting.

Brighton & Hove City Council is committed to delivering a city-wide School Streets programme to all eligible infant, primary and junior schools.



How School Streets Work

Motor vehicles are prohibited from entering a School Street during enforcement hours unless the user or vehicle is exempt. A Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) may be issued to vehicles that illegally access a school street in contravention of road traffic regulations.

The entrances to all School Streets are marked by signs that inform road users of the restrictions and enforcement hours.

Unless otherwise noted, all **School Streets** in Brighton & Hove are in force Monday to Friday from **8.15 - 9.15am** and **2.45-3.45pm**, during school term time only. They are not in operation on weekends or any school breaks or holidays.

Some **School Streets** may also operate with additional measures, such as gates, bollards, temporary barriers, or other traffic management devices.





Who is Exempt

The following users can access the street at all times:

- residents who live within the closed portion of the street
- resident who lives on streets connected to the closed portion of the street that must have access due to lack of another way in or out (such as culs de sac, one way streets, etc.)
- medical, therapeutic or care visitors to people who live within the closed portion of the street
- Blue Badge holders whose destination is within the closed portion of the street
- Employees or related activity of businesses or services operating within the closed portion of the street
- contracted school transport vehicles
- school staff members accessing schoolprovided off-street parking facilities or street parking within the closure

Emergency services and public transport vehicles are also allowed access at all times.



To reach the full potential for safety and community benefits that School Streets provide, we ask any motorists that are permitted to enter School Street to try and time their arrival and departure outside of the enforcement period.

Any exempt motor vehicles that cannot avoid entering or exiting a School Street during enforcement hours should proceed through at walking speed (5mph or slower) as there will be children in the road during these times.
